



Backworkstations

Back-to-Back Mailroom layouts are an efficient way to maximize your sorting capacity. There are two back-to-back styles available. **When utilizing two tables with sorters on each, you can simply place these units back-to-back.** This is the conventional method. It is very efficient and provides a large amount of mail openings for a mailroom with limited space.

However, to maximize the number of openings in a small

space without adding a large amount of furniture, **one table can be utilized to support two sorting systems placed back-to-back on one common tabletop.** The footprint of this configuration is small and compact.

Back-to-Back Mailroom Layouts can be placed in a row or parallel to one another to maximize the use of available floor space and to create the highest amount of sorter openings.



As shown in the photograph to the left, two L-shape workstations have been placed back-to-back to create a large mailroom layout. Closed storage has been added below the work surface to hide or store messy mailroom supplies and mail totes. Risers have been added to the work surface to lift the sorter units off the table top to maximize available workspace.

The photographs to the right depict two back-to-back layouts situated off to the side of the mailroom. These units can be considered internal mail units divided into two departments or separated by floor.

Modular components can be added above and below a workstation as required for additional storage. All sheet metal components are 14-20 gauge steel and adjust to a variety of heights to accommodate any worker. All modular tables are adjustable from 29" to 36" high and can support up to 1500 lbs.
